Ruffell Gets 23 As Cage Team Takes First Victory

Elsh Ruffell was back on the team Monday night as he led his Lovelady Hardware teammates to a 90-48 cage win over the Big Do-Nut Drive-In team in a Boys' Night Basketball League game at Compton.

Ruffell, who made the second team All-CIF during the past cage season, has been out for track. But he looped in 28 points Monday and was supported by some fine play by mates Jerry Mathews, Toby Venable and Bob Knapp, to pace the local team's win.

Mathews showed real poise in grabbing rebound after rebound for the locals. Their opposition was made up of Washington High School cagers.

It was a nip-and-tuck affair until Knapp pushed in a left-handed jump shot to send the locals ahead for good, 41-40.

Venable, Ruffell, Gene Orenshaw, Ray and Russ Vanderpool and Paul O'Kain made

their first appearance with the Lovelady squad. They were all out for spring sports at THIS and were ineligible prior to Monday's game.

The local squad is made up of Torrance High cagers who will return for the 1956-57 season.

The win was the first in league for the Torrance team and put it at 1-2.

Cooke, Denning, Relay Team Reach CIF Finals

Next-to-last in the series of track and field affairs to determine the state prep spike champs will be held Saturday at Inglewood when the CIF finals get the gun at 1 p.m.

Field events begin at 1, with the running events set to start at 1:30 at Sentinel Field.

Last week's semi-finals at Compton saw 10 Torrance preppers make their last appearance of the track season. Nine Torrance High spikers and a single entry from North

High were eliminated in the semi-finals.

Only Gary Cooke, Varsity 220; Larry Denning, Bee pole vault, and the Tartar Varsity 880-yard relay team managed to survive the torrid Compton tests. Cooke, who finished first in the furlong after taking third in the 100, will only go in the 220, since only two qualifiers in the running events were given the go-ahead to Inglewood.

Those eliminated include Gil Garnica, N.H.S. C high jump; Myron Schmidt, T.H.S. Varsity 440; Len Ehlers, T.H.S. 8 1/2; Bill Morris, T.H.S. C shot put; Cooke, T.H.S. 100; John Trenty, T.H.S. Varsity mile, and the Tartar 440-yard relay team of George Bosoon, Gary Vom Steeg, Dennis Lupin and Jim Patrick.

Several sterling performances were turned in by the vanquished, including Ehlers' 3:16.8 1320 and a good 45.3 quarter-mile relay lap by the Cee relay quartet.

Cooke was in the lead in the century dash at the halfway mark, but seemed to float to the tape in a close finish. He was beaten by Bill Clipper of Washington Junior High in 9.9.

Cooke Gets Even

Cooke measured Clipper in the 220 in a 21.8 heat. The lanky Tartar sprinter is a poor starter but eats up the yards in the furlong.

He faces a tremendous field Saturday, including defending state and CIF champ Bob Poynter of Pasadena, who has done 20.8 this season. Poynter and Cooke are both undefeated in the furlong. Also due to give Cooke a lot of trouble are Chaffey's Norm Jehle (21 flat), and Bob Walters, of Sweetwater, who turned the distance in 21.1 last week at San Diego.

Denning

Denning was the one of four vaulters to clear 12' in the Bee pole vault at Compton. His vault was a personal best and also set a new Torrance High Class B mark. Others who cleared that height and will be out to vie for the title Saturday include Barbee, Centennial; Byers, Long Beach Wilson; Breck, Santa Barbara; Dobbs, Lincoln, and Goulart, of El Cajon.

The Tartar relay team of Skip Smith, Dick Bentwood, Tom Brown and Cooke was in fourth spot when Cooke got the baton for the final 220 at Compton. He swept past two runners to get second place but couldn't catch Centennial's John Valery, who nipped down first for the Apaches. Centennial was clocked in 1:20.7, while Pasadena, which won the other heat, was led by Porter to a blazing 1:19.4.

Torrance's Varsity relayers were timed in 1:31.1.

Top three qualifiers Saturday at Inglewood will go on to the state meet at Chico on June 2. Pasadena and Centennial will probably fight it out for the CIF team title, which the Apaches won handily in 1955.

Golfers Clipped in CIF Tourney

Torrance teams fared poorly in the CIF team golf tournament Tuesday at Brookside Park in Pasadena as a durable Downey sextet took the 1956 title with a low of 482 for 18. Chula Vista was second with a 484, while Long Beach Wilson had a 485 for third.
