

City to Get \$54,010 In County Road Funds
 City Manager George Stevens has announced that Torrance will receive \$54,010 from the county for use in street improvement projects during the coming fiscal year. Stevens also said that the county had allotted the city about \$46,000 for similar purposes during the current period. Torrance's boost in population during the past year was the main reason for the increase, with allotment of funds made on a formula based 85 per cent on population and 15 per cent on mileage of city streets.
