

Bluebirds Shutout Lynwood Nine, 5-0

A four run barrage in the bottom of the eighth inning gave the Torrance Bluebirds a 5-0 win over the visiting Lynwood Merchants in a game played at Torrance Park Sunday afternoon. The win was the Bluebird's fourth straight of the season.

Tom Vanderpool and Jack Schlarb shared mound honors for the locals' shutout. The win went to Vanderpool.

The big eighth started with a walk by Schlarb. Then came a single by Bucky Kuhn, a double by Hank Camou, a double by Swayne Johnson, and a single by Bill Crawford before the Birds were retired. Kuhn led the local batters at the plate, with a double and a pair of singles in three trips for a perfect score. Crawford poked out two singles for a same average of .500.

Next outing for the Bluebirds will be Sunday against the Carmelita Provisions. The game time is 2 p.m. This will be the last home game for the Birds until July 8 when they open their defense of the Harbor League championship.
