

Gunmen Rob Liquor Store

About \$200 in currency and change was taken at gunpoint from the Walteria Liquor Store, 24212 Hawthorne Blvd., Monday night by two men who held two customers and a clerk at bay while they made their get-away.

Grant S. Stickney, a clerk, said the two came in flashing guns and ordered him to give them the money.

Detectives said that Stickney and one of the witnesses, Ivan Fields, of 23003 Evelyn Ave., both supplied them with descriptions of the robbers. The two descriptions were somewhat different, however, authorities said.

Stickney said both suspects were about 6 feet tall, 20-25 years old. One weighed about 140, he said, the other 150.

Fields called it differently, Detective Captain Ernie Ashton said. He reported both stick-up men stood about 5 feet six to seven inches and weighed about 70.

Pyle Tabbed To Head City's Community Chest Fund Drive

Richard S. (Dick) Pyle, manager of the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Co. in Torrance, has accepted chairmanship of this fall's Community Chest drive here.

Announcement was made yesterday by Arthur O. Otsea, also of Torrance, who is Harbor Area campaign chairman.

Pyle served as vice chairman of commerce and industrial donations to the Community Chest in the Harbor Area last year. For several years previously he was a Chest official in San Pedro.

Chamber Official
He is treasurer of the Torrance Chamber of Commerce and a member of the Torrance Kiwanis Club and the local branch of the Red Cross. Pyle has served with the telephone company for 30 years. He took

up his local position three years ago.

As father of a 15-year-old former Boy Scout, Pyle is particularly impressed with Red Feather youth serving agencies. He points out that more than 1000 Scouts are in the Torrance area and that \$7083 in Chest funds went to the local BSA movement last year. Another \$6000 went to San Pedro's Scouting program;

\$5000 to Wilmington; \$6000 to Gardena, and \$5000 to the Lomita-Harbor City Scouts.

"None who knows these facts can fail to be impressed," Pyle said. "Other Community Chest agencies directly serving Torrance and its citizens include Girl Scouts, Veterans' Service Center, YWCA, Visiting Nurses' Assn., Camp Fire Girls, Catholic Welfare Bureau, Family Service of Los Angeles, Salvation Army, and Children's Orthopaedic Hospital, and California Children's Hospital in Los Angeles," he added.

Pyle now is recruiting volunteers for other top Chest posts in the city. Other appointments will be announced soon, he concluded.
