San Pedran Unravels Tale Of Early Morning Robbery

An unusual tale of strong armed robbery was unfolded in the early hours yesterday morning by a San Pedro man, who said he was stopped and beaten on Crenshaw Blvd., near its intersection with Palos Verdes Drive North.

Edward J. Gerhard, 37, of 1369 W. 7th St., San Pedro, told sheriff's deputies he was driving toward Torrance on the hill at about 3:25 a.m. when the robbery occurred. He said he came upon a car parked across the road and when he came to a stop two young men got out of the car and proceeded to beat him and take his car keys.

Eye Bashed
 Gerhard said he had no sooner come to a stop when one of the men bashed him over the left eye, while the other snatched his car keys. They made him get out of the car, he related, and kicked him. The pair then took his driver's license from his wallet and a fingernail clipper, but didn't get any money, he told authorities.

The victim said he told the robbers he had only "a dime" on him, so they threw his wallet back, tossed the car keys away and drove off. Gerhard said he pushed his car until it rolled down Crenshaw. It came to a stop about a block from Pacific Coast Highway, he said. He put in a call to Torrance police, who called Lennox Sheriff's deputies into the case.

Refuses Treatment
 Gerhard described the two as being between 19 and 20 years old. They both weighed about 150 pounds, he told deputies. One of the robbers was about 5'7" tall, the other 5'9".

Despite the descriptions, Gerhard said he probably could not identify his assailants. He refused medical treatment, deputies said.
