


Obituaries

 Residents of the southern portion of Los Angeles County have repeatedly written to me about the San Diego Freeway. Some of them have said that they thought the Olympic Freeway, was being given priority over the San Diego Freeway. In order to obtain the facts, I wrote to the Division of Highways and received the following letter:

State Highway System, and on which freeway agreements and plans are well advanced, will be completed early in this 13-year period. There are other routes on the State Highway System forming a part of the Interstate network which are not so fortunate.
 Importance of Freeway
 The importance of the San Diego Freeway to communities in the southern portion of Los Angeles County is that it will take much of the traffic off the Highway 101 Alternate, which consists of Sepulveda Blvd., Pacific Coast Hwy. and other stretches of highway going through cities on or near the coast. Directly affected are Westchester, Playa del Rey, El Segundo, the Hollywood Riviera section of the City of Torrance, and Palos Verdes Estates. Communities which are indirectly affected are Inglewood, Lennox, Hawthorne, Lawndale, Portuguese Bend, and Rolling Hills. Obviously, San Pedro, Wilmington and Long Beach also have an interest in the San Diego Freeway.
 Information to Come
 It is apparent that the letter quoted above from the Division of Highways does not indicate a definite and early date for completion of the San Diego Freeway. However, as a member of the Joint Interim Committee on Transportation Problems, which holds hearings on freeways, I have asked the Division of Highways for
