Trees Plague Plaza Del Amo Area, Residents Says

Residents of the 2200 block of Plaza Del Amo, led by Mrs. Cora B. Bohrer, of 2227 Plaza Del Amo, are somewhat upset by an apparent refusal by the city to clean up that area by thinning out an unruly row of eucalyptus trees, Mrs. Bohrer told The HERALD this week.

Spurred on when the council, she claims, passed over a proposal by residents to tear down the trees, widen the boulevard and install sidewalks, Mrs. Bohrer went back to her neighborhood and began forming another avenue of attack. She circulated a petition to put the requests of the citizens in writing.

Then she and two constituents presented the petition at a recent meeting of the council. But it was filed, she added. The matter was revived, then tabled again Tuesday.

Official Agrees
 At the meeting a city official concurred with Mrs. Bohrer that a deep ditch running behind the trees long has been the favorite spot of parkers and drunks. According to Mrs. Bohrer, the trees are so close together that their debris continually litters the area. Drivers and pedestrians also litter the area, she said.

Councilman Victor Benstead retaliated by saying the trees were planted by the original settlers of the area and make the city beautiful.

No Sidewalks
 School children walk the heavily-traveled area without benefit of sidewalks, she continued.

She indicated also that she had talked with Torrance Unified School District officials about support in the clean up drive. School administrators said they were interested, however, only in tearing down some of the trees for additional parking space around their building, but they didn't care to have the street widened, she concluded.

While apparently expressing no decision on the matter, city officials did say it would cost more than \$8000 to accomplish the clean up.
