**Local Woman Witnesses Dramatic Train Christening As Guest of the Sante Fe**

Upon invitation of the Sante Fe Railroad, Mrs. Elsa F. Stone attended the christening of the new hi-level El Capitan train, held recently on a Sunday afternoon, on the station platform at Albuquerque, New Mexico.  
 According to Mrs. Stone the ceremony was a blend of the past and present as the new hi-level train and the old Atchison and Topeka and Sante Fe pulled into the station at the same time which was described as an event that would never happen again.  
 Greeting the two trains coming from opposite directions were Indians in colorful regalia accompanied by music and loud blasts of the train whistles.  
 The new train was christened with a bottle filled with water from the Great Lakes and Pacific Ocean by the Duke and Duchess of Albuquerque who came from Spain for the ceremony. The Duke whose informal name is Don Beltram Osorio y Dycide Rivera, gave some interesting sidelights on the origin of the name Albuquerque. He pointed out that contrary to belief there is absolutely no part of it of Portuguese origin as believed. It was given to the Cueva family of Spain in 1464 and was derived from the village of Albuquerque in the province of Badajoz in western Spain.  
 He further revealed the name itself came from a type of native tree, "Albur," an old word for tree and the "que" pertains to a type of olive.

Highlight of the ceremony was the appearance of the "Cyrus K. Holliday" train pulling two yellow coaches loaded with actresses who reenacted the arrival of the first Sante Fe train in Albuquerque in 1880. Bearded men wearing Prince Albert coats and top hats and women in old-fashioned dresses and carrying parasols of the gay nineties alighted from the train.  
 As a guest on the trip, the local woman was presented a Conquistador official certificate which signified that she was present at the christening.
