

Flood Control Work Started, Hahn Says

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn announced this week that two measures are now under way for the improvement of Dominguez Channel which should provide relief from flooding during the winter storms. This work is being done in accordance with Supervisor Hahn's request that all measures possible be expedited to the fullest possible degree to provide floor protection to the people of Torrance and adjacent areas. Torrance City Manager George M. Stevens recently called the problem to

Supervisor Hahn's attention. Maintenance crews are now cleaning the channel between Western and Rosecrans Aves., removing debris, weeds and other obstacles to the flow of water, and repairing the levee where necessary. This work is scheduled to be completed in another two weeks. The channel bed between 120th St. and Rosecrans, has also been sprayed with weed-killing chemicals. Realignment Planned Design crews are also drawing plans for permanent improve-

ment of the channel between Denker and Vermont Aves. The permanent improvement, which will be constructed on a new alignment south of Artesia Blvd., will include widening the channel to 75 feet on a 125 foot right of way and the construction of concrete banks, Supervisor Hahn said. The new alignment will eliminate two crossing under Artesia, but will require rebuilding of the Artesia bridge between Western and Gramercy, and new bridges over the channel at Normandie and

Vermont. Culverts to Go Construction of the new bridges should provide substantial flood relief, Supervisor Hahn pointed out, since it has been learned that much of the flooding in Torrance and Gardena last winter was caused by the inability of the culverts to handle the water, with the result that the bridges dammed the water, causing it to back up. Floor control engineers reported to Supervisor Hahn that they expect to have plans

for this project completed late this fall and that construction may begin this year. Construction of the permanent improvements and the new bridges will require at least one year. This project is a part of the overall improvement of the channel from the ocean to 120th St., at an estimated cost of \$19,000,000. One contract has been awarded for the construction of a new bridge near the mouth of the channel to prepare the way for further improvements upstream. Estimates Made Supervisor Hahn pointed out that the work north from Vermont would not have to wait for the downstream improve-

ments, however. Present plans call for earth banks on the channel from the harbor to Vermont. Concrete banks will be constructed between Vermont and 120th St. Estimates are now being prepared for the cost of the permanent improvement of the channel reach between Denker and Gramercy, so that this stretch can be improved immediately following the section between Vermont and Denker.
