Cerebral Palsy Center Benefit Fashion Show Slated For Oct. 12

Mrs. Genevieve Coulson of Torrance who has worked for two years in establishing the local center at 1217 Cravens Ave., will be in charge of fashions which will be provided by local merchants.

Mrs. Coulson is co-ordinating chairman of the event and will be assisted by Mrs. Gena Greayer, who is an art student at El Camino College and is making the programs for the show; and Mrs. Rosalie Geeseman who will be in charge of the models.

Caroline Leonetti will be the narrator of the show. She is a well known authority in the field of fashion and has taught charm, poise, and grace at Marymount College, Los Angeles and her own center in Los Angeles. She appears with Art Linkletter at the TV House Party show as well as "Queen For A Day."

The reason for the establishment of the center was due to the realization made through attempts to locate a school for CP children of this area. It was found that limited or no facilities were available for the treatment and training of children thus afflicted. The local center was founded by parents and persons interested in helping the CP child. The school is staffed by Mrs. Rose Patrick, registered nurse and resident of Torrance; Miss Ruth Aptaker, speech therapist.

Funds realized at this fashion show will be used to continue the treatment and training program now in session five, full days a week which has been so successfully conducted in the past and has aided the children enrolled at the center.

No part of the funds are used for expenses other than therapy and equipment at the school. Directors of the board for the school who donate their time and money to this worthy work are Mrs. Genevieve Coulson, Mr. and Mrs. Wesley Greayer, Mr. Anthony Durizzi, Beverly Asbury, Drs. Allen Pyeatt and Robert Barrett are the medical advisory board.
