## Dr. Phyllis Wright Is "Woman of Tomorrow"

Dr. Phyllis Wright, who won the hearts of the children and parents of the Harbor Area when she served as head physician in the pediatric service at the Harbor General hospital on the UCLA staff, was especially honored last Monday morning as one of the "Women of Tomorrow."

This honor was bestowed on Dr. Wright at the annual breakfast commemorating the Fifteenth Gold Key Anniversary of the Women's Committee of Welfare Federation of the Los Angeles area held at the Palladium.

Dr. Wright, who served for three and a half years at the Harbor hospital was transferred July 1 to UCLA where she is associate professor of pediatrics as well as assistant director of the Marian Davies Children's Clinic at the UCLA Medical Center.

Dr. Wright is a graduate of the Barnard College and the Cornell University in New York. Her husband, Dr. Stanley W. Wright, also an associate professor of pediatrics at UCLA.

During her three and a half years at Harbor, Dr. Wright won the esteem of the entire staff and under her direction one of the finest pediatric clinics in the west is now available to children in the surrounding area.

Prior to coming to Torrance, Dr. Wright and her husband spent two years in Japan, both working on long range research for the Atomic Bomb Casualty Commission at Nagasaki, Japan. From Japan, the two doctors made a trip around the world.

While in this area, the couple resided at 429 Via Los Miradores where they spent their free time raising Irish Setters.

Dr. Wright won recognition in the field of medicine. Other "Women of Tomorrow" represented law, business, art, journalism, drama, public health, social work, education, scientific research and music.

The Gold Key award for community service was awarded to Dr. Wright.
