

# Builder Milton Kauffman Dies

Milton Kauffman, 74, who headed an organization which built more than 5200 homes in Torrance during the past five years, died Sunday in Culver City Hospital after an illness of about a year.

Funeral services will be held this morning at 10 a.m. in the Malnow and Simons Chapel, 818 W. Venice Blvd., Los Angeles.

The builder, whose organization was probably Southern California's largest construction concern and one of the nation's largest, succumbed as the result of a long bout with heart trouble and diabetes.

**Local Homes Built**  
The Kauffman-Wilson organization built Southwest Park, Southwood Homes, and Storybook Homes in Torrance, a total of some 5200 dwellings.

"He was our largest developer and a real friend to Torrance," City Manager Stevens said. "I am sorry to hear of his passing."

A native of Tucson, Ariz., Mr. Kauffman had been in the real estate and subdivision business since 1906. He gained considerable prominence as an associate of the late E. J. "Lucky" Baldwin in the development of Baldwin Park.

Since then, the organization has subdivided homes on 49 tracts in Torrance, Hawthorne, Long Beach, Gardena, Compton, Norwalk, Whittier, West Covina, La Puente, and Lancaster.

**Large National Builder**  
In 1955, Time Magazine reported that the Kauffman-Wilson organization, which has headquarters in Gardena, was the fourth largest builder in volume of all construction firms in the United States. Many of the homes built were in Torrance.

He was a member of the Los Angeles Athletic Club, the Beverly Hills Club, the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce, and the Gardena Chamber of Commerce.
