**L.A. Schools Seek Teachers For Schools In This Area**

Immediate employment for elementary, junior and senior high school teachers in Harbor and South area schools is being offered by the Los Angeles City School System, according to Associate Superintendent William B. Brown, personnel division chief.

Interviews for these positions will be held at two locations in this area on Thursday and Friday, Nov. 15 and 16, Brown announced.

"Unprecedented growth of our Harbor and South area schools, and a continuing need for personnel available for substitute teaching made it possible for us to offer immediate employment," Brown stated.

**Part-Time Help Needed**

The school system is especially looking for qualified persons who are available for part-time duty and do not necessarily need a full-time position, Brown added, although openings are available for full-time teachers.

Applicants must not have reached their 55th birthday. Secondary applicants should have a bachelor's degree, and must have had directed teaching or at least one semester of successful public school teaching experience — or one year of successful experience in an approved private school. While the bachelor's degree and teaching experience are highly desirable for candidates for elementary positions, they are not required at this time. Elementary candidates must have completed three years of college. They will be selected on a basis of scholastic record, experience, maturity, and personal qualifications.

Successful applicants will be paid at the rate of \$425 monthly.

Interviews will be held starting at 9 a.m. on both days. They are scheduled for Thursday, Nov. 15 at San Pedro High School, 1001 W. 15th St. and Friday, Nov. 16, at Harbor Junior College, 1111 Figueroa Pl., Wilmington, Room 605 W.

Persons interested should bring a copy of their college transcripts.

Although the current recruitment drive is aimed primarily in securing part-time personnel, many positions are also available for persons wishing to teach full-time, Brown emphasized.

"Enrollments in local schools will continue to mount steadily in the next few years and we will always have a need for additional part-time and full-time teaching personnel despite regular recruitment efforts," the associate superintendent concluded.
