Our Mr. Sun  
**Telephone Co. Science Series to Debut Monday**  
The sun is so big you'd need a string of 340 earths to circle its girth. Its heat equals that of 10,000 hydrogen bombs exploded every second.  
"Our Mr. Sun," a new approach to scientific entertainment, splashes the colorful solar system across the nation's television screens Monday night, Nov. 19 when it leads off the Bell System's Science Series. The compatible colorcast over the CBS network will be seen on KNXT (2) at 7 p.m.  
Veteran Director  
The series is produced and directed by Frank Capra, making his debut as a television mentor. Capra, veteran of 35 years in the motion picture industry, is best known for his Academy Award-winning pictures, "It Happened One Night," "Mr. Deeds Goes to Town," and "You Can't Take It With You."  
Co-starring in the film are Hollywood's Eddie Albert, authority on education films, and Dr. Frank Baxter of "Shakespeare on Television" fame. Capra uses interplay between the live actors and cartoon characters to create a new dramatic technique in the program.  
Three More Planned  
Capra is currently producing three more programs for the series—on blood cosmic rays and weather—which will

be released during 1957.  
Preparation for the programs started in 1951 when meetings were held with leading scientists to devise ways of putting technical information into understandable terms.  
To assure final accuracy of "Our Mr. Sun" Capra, himself a graduate of Cal Tech, was advised by a special group of scientists known for their studies of the sun. They included Dr. Farrington Daniels, University of Wisconsin; Dr. Armin Deutsch, Mount Wilson and Palomar Observatories; Dr. Donald H. Menzel, Harvard Observatory; Dr. Walter Orr Roberts, High Altitude Observatory of the University of Colorado and Dr. Otto Struve, University of California.

An additional evening class in retail cashiering (grocery food checking) will begin at the Redondo campus of the South Bay Adult School this evening, according to school officials.

Certificates of completion for the 80-hour course, are given to successful students to aid them in obtaining employment.  
A fee of \$5 is charged to defray the cost of machine rental and students are expected to buy a textbook to use in drills with cash registers and checkout scales.

**Don't Drive With Parking Lights--CHP**  
Parking lights are not to be used as driving lights at any time on any public highway, was the warning issued yesterday by the California Highway Patrol.  
"The law expressly prohibits the use of parking lights as driving lights," declared Patrol Commissioner B. R. Caldwell. "The only time the use of parking lights is legal is when they are used as signal lamps in accordance with the vehicle code or as regular parking lights."  
The use of parking lights when driving at dusk, in fog or in rain tends to create a deception in the judgment of distance by the other driver," Caldwell continued. "The use of headlights gives a truer picture and aids the other driver in determining distance thus making for more safety for all."  
Obey the law and develop the habit of turning on the headlights, not the parking lights, when lights are needed or required," he concluded.
