### Aircraft Co. Workers Give Charity Cash

Employees of North American Aviation, Inc., have contributed \$10,640 to four beach city community chest drives through the company's voluntary DO (Donate Once) Club. The contributions are part of the club's \$125,000 gift to 47 community chests in three Southern California counties.


