
Following the El Segundo match, the Saxons varsity will meet Morningside and Hawthorne in league play before ending their season.

On the local deep sea front, front last week end also marked the taking of yellowtail at San Clemente Island. Pacific sportfishing reported five checked in for Saturday and Sunday. Doesn't sound like many, but these are the big ones that get away. Sunday, Pete Peters, skipping the Fisherman 2 estimated at least 40 hook-ups. Ones brought to gaff hit between 28 and 30 lbs. Lunkers scoot right for the kelp on feeling a tug and there aren't many ever worked out. Really a challenge to Isaac Waltons connecting. Griffin Registers Three League Marks as Centennial Wins Crown

Centennial's sensational Preston Griffin staged a one man show in the Bay League finals Friday, breaking three league records in leading his Apache teammates to a surprisingly easy championship. Included in his feats on the Mira Costa track was an unbelievable 220 clocking of 20.3 which will not be accepted as a new national interscholastic record due to wind conditions.

While his team piled up 62 1/2 points to top runner-up Santa Monica at 39 1/2, Griffin also roared to a 9.5 timing in the 100 and leaped 24 5/8" to set a Bay Loop mark in the broad jump. In last week's preliminaries, he also cracked Jesse Owens' 20.7 mark in the 220 with a 20.6 performance but wind also nullified that effort.

Other record-breaking performances included Santa Monica's Mike Kilbourne, who took the 180 low hurdles in 19 flat, and teammate Bob Hutchinson took the 440 in 49.9 Inglewood's Darian Calhoun equalled the 120 high hurdle mark at 14.2.

Torrance recorded two seconds in the meet as Len Ehlers placed in the mile and Tom Denning took runner-up honors in the pole vault. The varsity and B's finished sixth while the C's placed last.
