Local CAP Cadet To Tour Chile On Summer Trip

Seventeen-year-old Torrance boy, Leroy W. (Tom) Thompson Jr., who graduates from Serra High School next month, will leave in July for a month-long trip to Chile via Washington, D.C., as a guest of the Chilean government.

The local youth is one of 145 teenage cadets in the Civil Air Patrol taking part in this year's international cadet exchange program under which the best of the 38,000 youths in the CAP cadets will trade places for a time with their counterparts in 21 other countries.

Thompson was chosen for the Chile trip by cadets in the South Bay Squadron 43. In order to qualify, he was required to pass several eliminations and then went to San Francisco for inspection by a review board. His name was among those sent to national headquarters for final consideration.

He is presently cadet commander of his squadron with only two years as a CAP cadet behind him. He was recently promoted from sergeant to lieutenant.

Thompson will spend four days in Washington for briefing and orientation before leaving for Chile on an Air Force transport. His three weeks in the foreign country will be spent touring the country, visiting airports and flying foreign aircrafts.
