## Harvey's Huge New Press Makes Odd-Shaped Casts

Engineers can now look forward to new design criteria in aluminum forgings. Harvey Aluminum is now in full production on a forging press unparalleled in the aluminum industry—a 4000 ton hydraulic unit with side rams. In operation at the Torrance plant, the newly installed press makes it possible for Harvey to produce complex aluminum shapes and parts or back-drafts.

**43 Feet High**  
The press is of the down-stroke column type design and weighs 1,230,000 pounds. It has an over-all height of 43 feet. The size of the press bed between positive stops is 70 inches front to back and 90 inches maximum. The main ram can

center. Parts with unsymmetrical bosses also can be forged. Other aluminum forgings that can be produced advantageously on the new press include hydraulic cylinders, pistons with a dissimilar metal ring, and aircraft parts with attachment flanges.

The 400-ton unit is a part of Harvey's battery of hydraulic and mechanical forging presses which range in size up to 8000 tons capacity.
