

Herman Miller Takes Over Torrance Plymouth Agency

Torrance's newest auto dealer may be new to the city, but he has been in the new car business for more than 30 years.

Herman Miller, who recently purchased Whittlesey Motors, 1600 Cabrillo Ave., now calls the business Herman Miller Plymouth. He has the only exclusive Plymouth dealership in the South Bay area.

"We have 70 to 75 new cars on hand at all times," Miller said. "We have a big inventory of cars from which to choose. Our aim is to make all our customers happy."

Complete Service

Miller has retained the old employees of Whittlesey Motors, and has added new employees to round out a staff of about 30 persons. Operations include both new and used car sales and complete servicing for all Chrysler products.

The new owner has started a pick-up and delivery service on all cars services in his shop, and now is giving S & H Green Stamps with all repair and service work. He is the first auto dealer to offer this premium.

Miller's son, Fred, is associated with the firm, as vice president. He attended the University of California and played football at Los Angeles High School.

Raul Martinez serves as sales manager; Bob Wilshire heads the office staff; Tom Gilliam is service manager, and Earl Schaffin handles the parts department.

Both new and used cars are featured at Miller Plymouth. The used car department is temporarily located at the new car office.



Suicide Note Found in Car Of Dead Man

Leaving a suicide note rolled up in his wedding ring, a 35-year-old General Petroleum employee apparently took his own life in his garage, Torrance police reported Tuesday.

Randal Ernest Ashton, 411 Via Linda Vista, was found in his car about 5 a.m. Tuesday morning by his wife, Betty. Police said a hose was attached to the exhaust pipe and ran into the car. A suicide note was rolled up in his wedding ring and was found on the dashboard, according to officers. Efforts of Torrance firemen to revive him were in vain.

Private services will be held at Halverson-Leavell Mortuary Chapel at 10 a.m. tomorrow, with burial in Inglewood Park Cemetery.

A native of Los Angeles, he had lived in Torrance for the past six years.

Survivors include his widow; daughter, Gayle, and son, Randal Jr.


