

Legion Squad Beaten In Opener, 9-5

Torrance's American Legion entry opened the season in a losing effort Saturday, dropping a 9-5 decision to the Millikan squad at Torrance Park.

The team will attempt to hit the winner's circle this week-end with two games on tap. Saturday the local squad invades Wilmington but returns home to Torrance Park Sunday to entertain Compton. Both games are slated for 1 p.m.

Millikan bursted forth with five tallies in the second frame and were never headed as they battered three Torrance hurriers for 11 safeties. Russ Vanderpool, Stan Fittinger and George Fouts saw mound duty with Fouts taking the loss.

Russ Vanderpool and Toby Venable paced the hitting attack for coach Del Nuzem's club, getting three and two hits, respectively.

Bluebirds Notch Fourth Win; Top Teamsters, 6-3

Leading from the opening inning, the Torrance Bluebirds won their fourth practice contest in five outings Sunday with a 6-3 verdict over Teamsters Local 402 at Manchester Park.

Singles by Buck Kuhn, Larry Roy and Harry Theodis accounted for two tallies in the initial frame. The Birds added one more in the second when Hank Camou batted pitcher Francis Lucking, who had walked and advanced into scoring position on a single by Kuhn.

The hosts closed the gap to 3-2 in the third as a result of two errors and two hits.

However, the Bluebirds iced the contest in the sixth frame with a three run outburst with two away. Singles by Harry Smith and Kuhn, a double by Camou and an error on the left fielder on Roy's fly ball resuscitated the markers.

The Birds collected 12 hits with Kuhn going three for three.

Tartar, North Players Make All-Star Roster

League champions Redondo and Beverly Hills pace the early selections for the second annual Bay League-Pioneer All-Star game for the benefit of the Optimist home for boys. The clash will be held Saturday night, July 20, at El Camino College.

The Bay titlist Seahawks placed eight players headed by All-CIF backs Dean Moore and Bruce Siefert. Other backs named were Lynn Hoyem and Don Marone while linemen Gene McCann, Tom McDonald, Lou Cook and Art Webb also made the squad.

The second place Cougars notched seven team positions, six on the line. Named were George Hahlbeck, John Short, Lang Hobson, Joe Costanzo, George Walky and Ron Hagerthorne in the forward wall and back Ed Greevey.

Torrance won three team positions with end Tom Brown, guard Bill Montgomery and back John Emery making the squad. The Pioneer squad will boast only one North High representative in back Ray Grieshaber.

Rounding out the preliminary Bay League All-Stars, Centennial and Leuzinger each placed three. The Apaches will be represented by linemen Troy Amos, Alvin King and Bob Palmer while the Olympics will have linemen Bob Ripley, Bill Reames and Dave Test on the squad.

Inglewood players include guard Tom Herman and back Keith Jacobs while Mira Costa will send guard Mike McConnell and center Brian Watson. Santa Monica will supply tackle Jeff Sawyer.

Pioneer League champion Beverly Hills picked up three positions in tackle Hashim Hanief and backs Mitch Reines and Joe Rosenkrantz. Morningside will be represented by four players in backs Don Hodge and Jack Lee and linemen John Bishop and Jerry Butler. The Culver City griders include backs Lou Kadis and Mike Livesay and end Chuch Blauchamp. El Segundo rounds out the selections with linemen Noel Briese and Pat Hockenberry.

All selections were made by respective coaches Bob Cardona of the Bay Leaguers and Don Reed of the Pioneer squad. Cardona is from Redondo while Reed coaches at Culver City.

The Bay League team will pick up three additional players before training begins July 8 while the Pioneer squad must make five more choices to bring both squads to the 25-player limits. Training will be held at Mira Costa and Redondo High schools.


Dance Club Picnic
