

Will County Locate Sports Center Here?

Studying a busy agenda Wednesday night, the Torrance Recreation Commission:

1. Learned that the proposed regional county sports center in West Torrance is several years away, if it is developed at all.
2. Ordered an appraisal of Walteria Park after hearing an offer to buy it for commercial use.
3. Heard of plans to accept El Nido Park before July 1.
4. Learned that grass will be planted soon in Los Arboles Park.

Site Considered
Recreation Director Harry Van Bellehem told the commission that a Monday meeting between city and county officials brought out the fact that a West Torrance site is only one of three being considered as the site of a county recreation park. He understood that the county had not yet decided what type of park should be built, nor where it would be located.

It was indicated that development of the sports center here would be several years

Air Force To Recruit Women

Graduating high school women from the Torrance area will be able to qualify for equal benefits with young men eligible for enlistment in the Air Force, announced T/Sgt. William Vallery, local Air Force Recruiter.

Young women completing their education and interested in a career as a WAF (Woman in the Air Force) will, according to Sergeant Vallery, be eligible to qualify for almost any job handled by other airmen, and likewise earn the same benefits and privileges while serving in the Air Force.

WAF's are capable of performing approximately 80 per cent of these specialized tasks, and may be selected for training and work in any one of 34 different types of occupational fields.

High school graduate women, 18 through 34 years of age, who are single and in good physical condition, are eligible to apply for enlistment as WAF.

away, if it were developed. The commission again discussed the possible use of a 27-acre sump in the Southwest Park area, located nearby. The commission earlier had discarded the idea, but voted to study developments in other areas to see whether a sump could be made into a park.

Appraisal Asked
Appraisal of Walteria Park was recommended by the Commission, after the group heard an offer to purchase the property.

Sidney Kasden, Rolling Hills, said he is interested in developing the park for commercial purposes. He indicated that the property is too valuable a property to remain in use for parks, and said he has many large companies interested in setting up businesses on the site. He said that the Recreation Department's present building, on 242nd St. could be left where it is, for possible future use as a library.

Report Cited
Commissioner Robert Cramer noted that the Gold Report recommended that Walteria Park be abandoned in favor of a site on Madison St. south of Newton St. He said, however, that the Commission should wait until the bond issue is passed and not give up the present site until there is another to take its place.

Kasden indicated that his plans for the area are long-range, with no immediate development contemplated. A period of two or three years might be required to make the transition, he said.

As a result, the commission votes to include this park in the list of parks to be appraised under the Gold Report recommendations.

Grass Planned
Los Arboles Park, in the Palos Verdes Riviera area, will be planted with grass in the near future, the commission was informed.

The city will pass a resolution to accept El Nido Park before July 1, the commission was informed. The county has let contracts for improvements there and the transfer will be made then since Torrance last year annexed the area. The city of Torrance will develop the remainder of the Park.

The commission also recommended that Gene Pinski, 5331 Via del Valle, be hired to help study the park sites and for work on the forthcoming bond election.

Mrs. Tillim Again Named To Park Post

Mrs. Herma Tillim was re-elected to her second term as chairman of the Torrance Parks and Recreation Commission Wednesday night.

Two years ago, she led a drive for a new swimming pool for the city and is currently heading the commission which is studying a proposed large park development throughout the city. In an unsuccessful try for the City Council, she stressed recreation and youth projects.

A resident at 16914 Osaga Ave., she runs an employment agency in Torrance. In her spare time, she builds furniture for her home and raises flowers and vegetables.
