Mark Clifton To Discuss Fiction Field

Mark Clifton, South Bay writer, will be the featured guest speaker at the Friday meeting of the Southwest Manuscripters, at 8 p. m. in Clarn

Stadium, Hermosa Beach. Clifton, who has been called one of the top 10 writers of science-fiction in the world, has plenty of awards to back up this distinction.

He won the Jules Verne Award for the best novelette of 1953, and was co-winner of International Science Fiction Award for the best novel of 1955.

Twenty anthology collections contain Clifton stories, and for the past four years he has been included in the best stories of the year. He has also

appeared in various magazines and book collections in England, Sweden and Argentina. One anthology has included a Clifton story in the collection of the 14 greatest fantasy

short stories ever written, where he is associated with such names as Jack London, Andre du Maurier, etc.

Some of Clifton's work has also been dramatized for radio, and has appeared on NBC's X-Minus One.
