

Parks Plan Limited Play Slate July 4

The Torrance Recreation Department will maintain its recreation program on a limited basis at the parks throughout the city on July 4. A skeleton crew will be on hand to check in and out such equipment as bats and balls, ping-pong balls, checkers, chess and other playground games from 9 a. m. to 5 p. m. There will be no organized activities or special events but there will be limited supervision.

This program is in keeping with the philosophy of maintaining maximum use of the facilities available and providing a means of recreation for the children of Torrance on a day by day basis, according to Director Harry Van Bellechem. All of the parks will remain open on July 4 and include El Nido, 182nd and Kingsdale; El Retiro, 126 Vista Del Parque; McMaster, 3624 W. 174th St.; Sea-Aire, 22730 Lupine Dr.; Torrance, 200 Sante Fe; and WALTERIA, 3855 W. 242nd St.

Localite to Discuss Law Enforcement

L. D. C. Cook of the Torrance Police department will be among the more than 400 state and local officials and community leaders gathering in Los Angeles Friday and Saturday to discuss "Juvenile Violence-Causes and Cures."

The group will meet with Attorney General Edmund G. Brown as a part of the current study of the Citizens Advisory Committee to the Attorney General on Crime Prevention. Juvenile Court Judge, Burdette E. Daniels, of Los Angeles, is chairman of the southern committee and will be general chairman of the two day conference.

Figures indicate that 60 per cent of all crimes of violence committed in California are by persons under 21 years of age, the Attorney General said.

Stop Off on Those Long Trips

Fatigue and sleepiness are definite accident causing factors in traffic says the California Highway Patrol.

"Last year in California we averaged 270 fatal and injury traffic accidents per month charged to drivers apparently asleep, or where fatigue was an element", Patrol Commissioner B. R. Caldwell declared.

"Fatigue and sleepiness are generally the result of excessive hours of driving or driving without sufficient rest or sleep prior to the trip," Caldwell stated. "The control of this problem obviously, adequate sleep and rest plus less travel hours on long trips.

If it is necessary to drive long hours, share your driving and stop frequently so you can get out and stretch," he concluded. A substantial breakfast but no heavy meals during the driving hours and a good night's sleep will help you stay alert and prepared to avoid the hazards of fatigue and sleepiness behind the wheel."

Spots Still Fashionable

City Allotted \$239,920.82

A record total of \$29,219,479 of state gasoline tax revenues has been apportioned to 338 cities in California for city street work and engineering during the current fiscal year, State Director of Public Works Frank B. Durkee announced today.

This is more than \$2,000,000 over last year's record of \$26,957,868.

The total apportionment to Torrance for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1957, was \$239,920.82.

The gas tax distributed to cities for street work is the revenue from five-eighths of a cent per gallon out of the state gasoline taxes paid by highway users and is apportioned by the State Division of Highways from the State Highway Fund according to law on a population basis.
