

'Camera Day' Scheduled At Beach Sunday

Cabrillo Beach, San Pedro, located at the foot of the breakwater which forms Los Angeles Harbor, will be the scene of next Sunday's third session of the five lensfests slated in the sixth annual series of Camera Days, the City Recreation and Park Dept. reported yesterday.

On hand to pose on sailboats and speedboats, or against the background formed by the rocks of the breakwater and similar beach settings, will be 20 selected sun-tanned beauties, several "old salts," and six costumed Hawaiians, according to Clarence Inman, chairman of the 1957 Camera Day committee and staff photographer in the Recreation and Park Dept.

Settings Offered
Hundreds of Los Angeles-area shutterbugs have attended each of the 1957 Camera Days which provide, without charge, picture settings not usually available to individual lens-hobbyists, Inman said.

Reminding photographers who are registered to have their cards checked by a member of the Camera Day committee at the Aug. 11 event, Committee Chairman Inman said that any one not registered, and who wishes to compete in the Camera Day Photo Contest, which will be staged immediately following the final Camera Day on Oct. 13, must sign up with the committee next Sunday.

Days Planned
The final two Camera Days will be staged at Pacific Palisades Playground on Sept. 8, and at Griffith Park's Travel Town on Oct. 13, Inman said.

Chippewa Powwow Day Camp Offers Outdoor Activities

The Torrance Recreation Dept. is sponsoring, as a part of its summer vacation program, a series of Chippewa Powwow day camps, held alternately at El Retiro and Torrance Parks.

The program currently in session is being held at El Retiro Park and will continue through Friday. The last day camp is scheduled for next Monday through Friday at Torrance Park.

The day camp will be in session Tuesday through Friday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Campers are accepted on a first-

come-first served basis with a maximum of 45 campers per session. They must be between the ages of 7 and 12 years.

Registration Set
The registration fee for four days at camp is \$4. This charge covers the cost of cook-outs, but for field trip, craft supplies, and leadership.

Application may be made by procuring an application blank at the local park or playground or at the Torrance Recreation Dept. office, 3031 Torrance Blvd.

Some of the many activities available to the campers in-

clude hiking, cook-outs, field trips and camp skills. Emphasis is placed on basic camp craft skills and progression of simple cooking skills.

Hiking will consist of a nature study throughout the park. The camper will collect specimens of plant and small insect life for their individual nature books. During the last session they will take a field trip to Ferndale at Griffith Park. While there, they will have an opportunity to observe things of nature and to visit the observatory. On the day of the field trip the campers will

bring their own lunches and participate in a picnic.

Lighting Fires
When cooking out, they will learn the skills of making and lighting a fire, preparing the food and serving it. In addition they will learn to prepare such desserts as mock angel food cake, scones (graham crackers with marshmallow and chocolate), and candied apples.

Craft articles that will be made include lemming sticks (the Indians used them) for use in singing and rhythms; sit-a-pons (the Indians used them as mats) and Indian bracelets out of

aluminum and lanyard materials, and name tags out of bark and alphabet noodles.

Some of the camping skills that will be taught in this day camp include the use of an axe and knife; how to roll up sleeping bags; basic first aid and knot tying.

Other Activities
Also scheduled as extra activities are singing, folk dancing, games, a treasure hunt and a hat contest. The types of songs that will be sung are the old camp fire variety, rounds and those just for fun.
