'Soul' Named Lesson Topic

This Sunday

"He that is our God is the God of salvation; ... Sing unto God, ye kingdoms of the earth." These words of David are the Golden Text keynoting the Sunday service on "Soul" in all Christian Science churches. (Ps. 68:20, 32).

"How transient a sense is mortal sight, when a wound on the retina may end the power of light and lens!" exclaims Mary Baker Eddy in "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures." She continues, "But the real sight or sense is not lost. Neither age nor accident can interfere with the senses of Soul, and there are no other real senses. It is evident that the body as matter has no sensation of its own, and there is no oblivion for Soul and its faculties" (p. 214).

Jesus exemplified this declaration in restoring sight to the two blind men who besought him, saying, "Thou son of David, have mercy on us." Jesus said unto them, "Believe ye that I am able to do this? They said unto him, Yea, Lord. Then touched he their eyes, saying, According to your faith be it unto you. And their eyes were opened."
