

Hills Echo Sounds of Cannon as Guardsmen Go Through Training

The hills of Hunter-Liggett Military Reservation are reverberating to the boom of big guns this week as tanks and howitzers of Southern California's 40th Armored Division conduct their annual firing practice.

Scores of tanks, with their 76-mm and 90-mm guns pouring out a deadly stream of high explosives, are utilizing Stony Valley Range, once a quiet hunting course in the widespread Hearst Ranch holdings. The artillery's huge 105-mm and 155-mm self-propelled howitzers, in turn, are firing thousands of rounds across the rolling contours of Nacimiento Range, also a part of an old Spanish land grant.

The booming of high explosive shells are adding to the din of thousands of smaller weapons—rifles, machine guns, rocket launchers and mortars—which the National Guardsmen are learning to use in the only realistic method—by actual daylight to sundown shooting at battlefield-type targets.

In Second Week
Sunday marked the beginning of the second week of summer field training for the Southern Guardsmen. Some 5500 are training at Roberts and at nearby Hunter-Liggett while another 1000 are being integrated into closely coordinated tank crews by Regular Army specialists at the Armored Combat Training Center, Camp Irwin, near Bristow. The Camp Roberts contingent moved into the field Sunday following a week of preliminary instruction and "dry runs" in training areas near camp. Individual weapons practice and classes in all the highly specialized skills needed by modern armored soldiers filled

much of the first week. **Southland Soldiers**
Men of the 40th now engaged in their annual 15 days of field training came from almost every Southland community and maintain headquarters in 50 armories. Nearly 900 members of the division are currently taking active duty training of one kind or another at other Regular Army posts, most of them participants in the mandatory six-month basic training program deferred for all untrained recruits. Others are studying at

specialist schools from Ft. Ord, Calif., across the country to the Signal Corps school at Ft. Monmouth, N. J. and the Armor School at Ft. Knox, Ky. "Atomic-age warfare calls for hard-hitting armored units that are lean and mean," declared Maj. Gen. Homer O. Eaton Jr., division commander. "Our training is aimed at producing just that kind of a division."
Reorganization Due
The new "pentomic" concept calls for divisions to be organized into several self-contained, heavily powered units capable of operating independently when contact is lost

with higher headquarters through enemy action. Although the 40th has not yet been revamped into the modern concept, the reorganization is due in the future, according to high Army officials. The Guardsmen will end their summer training and return to home-towns this week end, Aug. 24-25.
