

Professor to Tell Writers About Theater, Television

Guest speaker for the Sept. 20th meeting of the Southwest Manuscript writers will be W. David Sievers, associate professor of Speech and Drama at Long Beach State College.

Sievers has an impressive background as a writer, teacher, director, and actor. His book, "Freud on Broadway," was recently given high praise by the Mental Hygiene Quarterly.

Before coming to Long Beach, Sievers completed his doctorate at the University of Southern California and taught drama at UCLA and Stanford. He has also worked professionally in the theater as an actor and stage manager in New York. Programs that he has written for radio and television include Count of Monte Cristo and Larry Finley.

At present, Sievers teaches history of the theater as well as playwriting and is also director of the dramatics program.

Sievers' talk to the Manuscript writers is entitled "The Writer—The Fair-Haired Boy of Theater and Television." A capacity audience is expected at the coming meeting, according to Dorothy V. Boesch, co-program chairman.

State Okays Money for 2 New Schools

Money for the construction of Jefferson and Calle Mayor Elementary Schools has been tentatively allocated by the State Allocations Board, the Torrance school board was informed Tuesday night.

The move paves the way for construction of the two new schools, which officials hope to have ready by next September. Calle Mayor, to cost about \$550,000, will be located just north of South High School, while Jefferson School will be built near Talisman and Carson Sts. for some \$590,000.

The school district already owns the Jefferson site, but further work is needed on the title and drainage problems of Calle Mayor School. Construction work may start within two or three months.

In other action, the board agreed to purchase 6.64 acres near 170th and Yukon for the proposed Yukon Elementary School. The owner, Hilario S. Alwag, would receive \$100,000 for the site.

Working drawings for the second portion of South High School now are complete and bids will be sought as soon as the regional engineer of the
