

# Compton Backs Move to Get Harbor Freeway Completed

Strong support for Supervisor Kenneth Hahn's campaign to secure funds for extension of the Harbor Freeway from 124th to 190th street came this week as the city council of Compton adopted a resolution urging that the necessary funds be budgeted and that the project be given priority.

Supervisor Hahn recently led a large delegation of public officials and civic leaders of the southwest and Bay cities to

Sacramento to attend the budget hearing of the State Highway Commission and urge inclusion of funds to continue the freeway construction to 190th St.

**Plans Completed**

It was pointed out that the plans for the next segment of the Harbor Freeway are completed, the right of way secured, and that the project can go to contract as soon as funds are provided by the

State Highway Commission. In adopting its resolution, the City Council of Compton pointed out that the Harbor Freeway serves as a major north-south route serving the Compton area but that "the section now under construction terminates at 124th St. making it necessary for people in the Compton area to travel a considerable distance over narrow and inadequate surface roads before reaching the be-

ginning of the freeway." The resolution urged that the funds be included in the State Highway Commission's budget for 1958-59 and that "contracts be awarded at the earliest possible moment," to extend the freeway to 190th St.

## Specialist Aids Chest Campaign
