### Osteopathic Student, Wife Lead Fund-Raising Drive for Hospital

A Torrance man and his wife are the champion fund-raisers for the Bay-Harbor Osteopathic Hospital fund campaign which last Sunday moved within \$75,000 of the total needed to assure a hospital for the area.

Drs. Roger and Eleanor Z. Thill, both optometrists with offices in Waveria, has raised \$42,000 in pledges so far. Dr. Roger Thill is also a senior student at the osteopathic college. He will graduate this year, spend a year interning, and will open offices in this area.

**"Hospital Day"**

Success of a community-wide "Hospital Day" service in churches of Lomita and Harbor City Sunday brought total pledges over the \$300,000 mark. Practicing osteopaths have pledged \$206,000 toward the hospital.

Pledges from organizations, industry, and the general public have added \$100,000 more to bring the drive within \$75,000 needed to insure final approval of a \$594,882 grant from the federal government. Deadline for raising the funds is Dec. 9.

Osteopathic doctors of the district Sunday turned out to church services throughout the area and members of the Harbor City-Lomita Ministerial Association delivered special "Hospital Day" sermons.
