'Adam, Fallen Man,' Named Sunday Topic

The Lesson-Sermon in each Christian Science church this Sunday is "Adam and Fallen Man."

The difference between the accounts in the first chapter and the second chapter of Genesis will be discussed and the way of redemption from the Adam man will be stressed. The Golden Text of the sermon contracts the two stated origins of man as darkness and light in the words of David the Psalmist, "Unto the upright there ariseth light in the darkness" (112:4).

God's challenging words to Adam, "Where art thou?" are followed by a statement from the third chapter of Genesis: "I heard Thy voice in the garden, and I was afraid, . . . and I hid myself" (3:9, 10).

From "Science and Health with Key to the Scripture" by Mary Baker Eddy a passage follows, "Ashamed before Truth, earth shrank abashed from the Divine voice calling out to the corporeal senses. . . The first impression material man had of himself was one of nakedness and shame. Had he lost man's rich inheritance and God's behest, dominion over all the earth? No! This had never been bestowed on Adam" (p. 532).

EMPLOYEES AT Douglas Will Get Pay Hike

Wage rates of hourly employees at the Douglas Aircraft Co. plants throughout the area, including the Torrance plant, will go up 2 cents, company officials said Monday.

The raise was part of a cost-of-living increase based on the Bureau of Labor Statistics index. The latest raise will be in effect until Feb. 2 when it will be adjusted again in accordance with current figures. These raises have resulted in a 12-cent increase in wage rates since it was begun on Aug. 1, 1956.

Some 55,000 employees in Southern California will be affected at a total annual cost of about \$1,500,000.
