Accountants Hear Panels On Taxation

In business there are many more varieties of taxes and problems connected with taxes than the average individuals tax payers know of.

A highly qualified panel of tax experts converged at the Lafayette Hotel in Long Beach last night to cover the subject of taxes and trends among new and existing corporations.

Discussed were the problems of corporations being acquired through mergers and other forms of consolidations, and the effect on the taxes when corporations follow present trends toward integration and versification through the technique of acquiring smaller corporations with growth potential. Also covered, were tax techniques and pitfalls of taxable or tax free acquisitions of such corporations and the sales tax aspect of such transactions.

Speakers Named
Torrance members of the Long Beach Chapter of the National Assn. of Accountants had an unusual opportunity to hear speaking on these timely subjects, Dean S. Butler, a member of the firm of Willis & Mac Crackin. Butler is a certified public accountant and a member of the California Bar Assn. He is also lecturing in corporation tax law at the University of Southern California School of Law.

Another member of the panel was Warren Sikora, attorney at law holding a masters degree in accounting from Chicago University. Sikora has for several years been an instructor at the University of California in advanced accounting problems.

The third member of the team was Gordon T. Stine, Certified Public Accountant, and assistant manager of the tax department of Ernest & Ernest. Stine holds a masters degree in business administration and is well known for his assistance in the annual revision of a hand book on various taxes in California entitled "Guide Book of California Taxes."

The National Assn. of Accountants was founded in 1919 as the National Assn. of Cost Accountants.
