CRANBERRY-ORANGE SALAD
1 pkg. orange or lemon flavored gelatin
1 pt. cranberry juice cocktail
1 2-oz. pkg. cream cheese
1/2 cup milk
1/2 C. dried, crushed pineapple
1 C. finely chopped celery
1/2 C. heavy cream, whipped
Heat 1 C. of the cranberry juice cocktail almost to boiling and dissolve gelatin in it. Add remaining juice. Put cream cheese into gelatin mixture and beat until smooth. Chill until partly set. Add salt, pineapple and celery

CRANBERRY POWDER
I can jellied cranberry sauce
1/2 C. water
1 C. lemon juice
1/2 C. orange juice
1/2 tsp. almond extract
1/2 C. ginger ale
Lemon slices
Whole cloves

LEMON-FROSTED GLASSES
Dip rim of glasses into a saucer holding 1/4 inch of lemon juice. Then dip in another saucer holding granulated sugar. Lift out carefully and set glasses upright on a tray. Chill in refrigerator until ready to use.
