

## Hampton Players Extends Run of 'Seven Year Itch'

Hampton Players' current show, "The Seven Year Itch" has proven such a hit, according to Director Jim Reeves, that it will have an extended run. Originally scheduled to close this Saturday, there will now be performances on Dec. 6, 7, 13, and 14.

The premise of this play is a natural for adult comedy. Richard Sherman (played by Dick Miller of Rolling Hills) is left alone in his apartment while his wife (Pat Rogers of Hollywood Riviera) and son (Keith Homer Snook, aged 6) summer at the beach. A pretty young model (played by Connie Wills) is using the apartment upstairs. A potted plant falls from her window, barely missing his head, and things are off to a good start.

The real situation is comical enough, but it is the adventures Richard imagines himself

in which really keep the audience in stitches. Lights fading up and down on Hampton's attractive set take him from reality to dream and back again, in a role that keeps Dick Miller constantly on stage.

Others in the cast are Jack Drake as the harried psychiatrist, Neil Werner as the misunderstood friend of the family, and Marie Denn, Jean Snyder and Marie Kluga as the lovely ladies Richard fondly imagines as madly in love with him. Jean Snyder also does the off-stage voice of "The Girl's" conscience, while George Hocutt, who is also assistant director and handles the music, doubles as bass as the voice of Richard's conscience.

## Christmas Gift Order Can Mean Flowers Next Spring

Whether you call someone on your Christmas shopping list "hard to please" or "discriminating" depends largely on how fond you are of the individual friend or relative. Whichever term you use, a gift order may answer that "what to give" question. Nursery merchandise orders in all amounts are now issued by many local nurseries throughout the state.

There is always a wide selection of items from which the recipient of a gift order may choose, says the California Association of Nurserymen. The selection includes indoor and outdoor plants, gardening tools and gadgets and gardening "how to" books.

**Indoor Plants**  
Among the indoor plants from which selections may be made at Christmas time are African Violets, Poinsettias, Philodendrons and various species of ivy. There are innumerable outdoor plants, but two popular plants blooming in

winter give the shopper the opportunity to see the flowers on the shrubs he purchases: early camellias and azales.

Another possibility for the recipient of a gift order is to pre-order bare root stock for planting in mid-winter. Roses are only one of many shrubs which may be purchased this way.

**Spring Bulbs**  
Spring-blooming bulbs are also stocked by nurseries during the weeks after Christmas when the merchandise orders will probably be used.

Numerous gadgets are stocked by nurseries including tools, attractive plant containers, ceramic figurines and bird baths.

Another area of selection for gift order shoppers is the gardening books usually stocked by local nurseries. There "how to" guides are becoming increasingly popular and more are issued each year.
