

Baptist Church Slates Sunday Groundbreaking

Climaxing a full schedule of activities Sunday in the South Bay Baptist Church, 4565 Sharynne Lane, will be the ground-breaking ceremonies at 3 p.m. to mark the beginning of construction of a new two-story Sunday school building.

When completed it will accommodate four department complete with assembly and classrooms.

Dr. J. C. Brumfield, pastor, will speak at both worship services. At the morning service at 11 a.m. he brings the third message on the subject "The Savior's Service for Sinning Saints" when he speaks of "The Conversion of Sinning Saints."

Baptism Set
A baptismal service will be included in the evening worship hour at 7:30 p.m. The sermon topic during this hour is "The Truth About Divine Healing." Toddler care and a complete modern crib nursery is available at all state church services.

During the morning worship hour a junior church service is held for children through nine years of age.

Sunday school for all age groups convenes at 9:45 a.m. December has been declared "Loyalty Month." A Rally Day has been planned on Dec. 15 at which time all Sunday school classes have been invited to remain for the morning worship

'Messiah' Presentation Slated This Sunday at 4

Final rehearsals are being held this week and all is in readiness for the largest mass presentation of Handel's great oratorio, "The Messiah," in 75 different locations within Southern California and Nevada next Sunday at 4 p.m.

"The Messiah" will be sung from Las Vegas to El Segundo, and from Santa Barbara to the Mexican border. The rapid year-to-year growth of the event indicates that it may spread state-wide and nationwide some time in the future.

11th Performance
Under co-sponsorship of the Church Federation of Los Angeles and the Southern California Council of Churches, this is the 11th annual presentation of Handel's great work in this manner. Eleven years ago there were 10 choirs in the Southland. Now there are 75. Each year it increases in size, scope and influence. Today, it is the largest musical effort of its kind in the nation, and possibly the largest in the world, according to Dr. Forest C. Weir, executive director of the church federation.

Director of the local performance will be Leslie Somerville. Soloists will be Mary Bradley, soprano; Elizabeth Reisa, contralto, and Wayne Smith, tenor. The bass soloist's name was not available yesterday due to last-minute difficulties.

Accompanists will be Minabel Hunt at the organ, and Shirley Ronning, of the First Christian Church, at the piano.

Coordinator Blind
Over-all coordinator and director is Dr. Gordon Bachlund, head of the department of the worship and the arts for the church federation. He is the man who founded "The Messiah" festival.

"He will be unable to hear the fruits of his labors," said Kesselman. "He will be seated by a battery of phones in Los Angeles, ready to call in any alternate choirmasters or soloists, should anyone have a trouble or an accident, come up ill, or be faced by some other eventuality that would prevent an appearance. New Light on Prayer




