

Tighten Belts, Supervisors Tell County Group

Acting on a motion by Supervisor Kenneth Hahn, the Board of Supervisors Tuesday issued a "tighten-the-belt" order to all department heads who have now started preparing next year's budget.

Supervisor Hahn's motion for the exercise of utmost economy in setting up departmental budgets was unanimously approved.

"I think that each person responsible for preparing budgets at the department level should be more concerned with places where expenses can be cut than in asking for more

money," Supervisor Hahn declared.

Cuts Sought

He pointed out that last year he had advocated cutting \$21 million out of the budget and that the proposed budget was reduced by \$16 million.

As a specific example of how expenses can be reduced, Supervisor Hahn pointed out that it was first proposed to spend \$1,600,000 in furnishing the new County Courthouse.

As a result of his study of the proposed furniture and equipment, which included such

items as \$23 wastebaskets, the amount was cut in half.

Economy Pledged

In a second motion today, Supervisor Hahn urged that the Board of Supervisors instruct the County Purchasing Agent, now advertising bids for the furniture for the Courthouse, to purchase furniture which would be adequate and useful and at the lowest possible cost.

As a result of this motion, the bids for the furniture will be reviewed by the Board after they have been submitted.

Extension Gets Board Approval

Extension of Hawthorne Blvd. from Torrance across the Palos Verdes Peninsula to the ocean at Palos Verdes Dr. South was assured today with the approval by chairman of the Board of Supervisors, Burton, W. Chace, of plans and specifications for the first leg of the project.

At the same time, the board called for bids covering the initial phase of the extension from Silver Spur to Crest Rd. for an estimated cost of \$400,000. Chace pointed out that the project of Hawthorne, a "master plan" highway, will ultimately provide direct access from Los Angeles southerly to the ocean and will help relieve week end traffic congestion along the scenic Palos Verdes Dr. South.



Rose Parade Float Funds Still Rising

Contributions continue to arrive at the Torrance Chamber of Commerce for membership in the Torrance Tournament of Roses Assn. Chamber officials said yesterday.

Membership cards have just been printed and will be mailed to anyone donating one dollar or over toward Torrance's entry into the fabulous Tournament of Roses Parade on New Year's Day.

Chairman George Bradford of the Chamber Float Committee said returns were not particularly encouraging to date but that most service clubs have indicated a willingness to participate.

The Chamber office is mailing letters to all businessmen in hopes of raising the necessary

\$4500 to finance the entry.

President A. E. Thompson said the public appeal was necessary because of the late approval of Tournament of Roses officials for Torrance's entry.

"Most citizens of Torrance have indicated they feel we should be represented New Year's Day—we hope now they all help in the financing." The Chamber leader said in future years this type of appeal should not be necessary, he reported.
