Human Rights Day Meeting Set Tuesday

what kind—and for whom? These questions will be discussed for all interested South Bay residents by the American Assn. for the United Nations on Human Rights Day, Tuesday.

The AAUN program will begin at 8 p.m. in the auditorium of the Gas Co. building, 306 S. Catalina Ave., Redondo Beach. It will mark the ninth anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, first proclaimed to the world by the United Nations General Assembly in 1948.

Program Planned
The program has been designed for the public, along with the AAUN general membership, with UN films, photo-

graphic displays, literature and a discussion period during refreshments.

The rights of the "littles humans," the world's 900,000,000 children, will be emphasized in one full-length short film produced by UNICEF (The United Nations Children's Fund) and in a special display of UNICEF Greeting Cards.

Refreshments will be served after the films, during a get-acquainted period. The audience will be invited to see and discuss new United Nations literature which is supplied by the AAUN as a service to the public. On special display will be the UNICEF Greeting Cards, one of the few ways the public may directly contribute to the Children's Fund.

Each box of 10 cards cost \$1.25 Every dollar goes directly to work in some vital emergency area in the world, and is "matched" with another dollar or more, by the country receiving it.

One penny will provide enough vaccine to insure a child in India against TB. One nickel will buy enough penicillin to cure a child in Africa of the life-long horrors of yaws. One dollar buys enough sulfone tablets to treat a child in Nigeria for leprosy for three years.

Lions Club to Hear Address by Rabbi at Tuesday's Gathering

LIONS CLUB

Rabbi Isaac E. Bloch will speak to the Torrance Lions Club, Tuesday noon, at the Palms on "The Middle East Crisis."

Educated in England and the Holy Land, Rabbi Bloch is a member of a noted English Rabbinical family. In World War I, he served on the staff of General Allenby with the British Army in the Middle East and later served with the British Mandatory Government of Palestine. He was ordained as a rabbi in Jerusalem by the late Chief Rabbi Isaac Hacoen Kook.

An auxiliary chaplain in the Air Force during World War II, he is now chaplain at Vincent Air Base and Army Test Station, Yuma, Ariz. He is the only circuit rabbi on the West Coast, covering an area of some 4000 square miles.

Last summer, while visiting Israel, he was given an audience with the Honorable Izak Ben Zvi, president of Israel. He was in the area at the time of Nasser's seizure of the Suez Canal.

Private interment followed.


City Manager's Mother Passes
