

Race Fans Show All-CIF Football Players For '58 Marked Interest In Sports Cars

Unprecedented interest is being displayed in Ascot Stadium's New Year's Day program of professional sports car racing, officials reported today.

Thousands of out-of-town visitors in the Southland for the Rose Parade and Rose Bowl game, many of whom are unable to obtain tickets for the latter event, have heard of the fabulous growth in sales of sports cars hereabouts — and want a first-hand look at the imported "bugs" in action. Too, many American autos will be competing on the half-mile clay oval.

Ascot's 150-lap main event will be patterned after the famed Italian Monza classic, and will be run in three 50-lap sections with a 12-minute interval between them for purposes of needed repairs, rests for the drivers and refueling, officials announced.

Each segment has been titled in honor of an outstanding sports car personality. First is the "Hawthorn Fifty," named for England's Mike Hawthorn, winner of the 1958 World's Championship. Next is the "Ferrari Fifty" for Enzo Ferrari, builder of the championship-winning automobile. Third is the "Bryan Fifty," honoring Arizona's Jimmy Bryan, two-time winner of the Monza international classic and also winner of the Indianapolis "500" last Memorial Day.

Time trials will begin at noon, with the first event at 2 p.m. The program includes a 4-lap sprint dash for the top four qualifiers, followed by a 6-lap Women's Race, a 25-lap consolation, and finally the three 50-lappers. The latter will involve the day's fastest 12 qualifiers from the over 1600 cc. classes and 12 from the under 1600 cc. division.

Admission is \$2 for all seats. The track is located on South Vermont Avenue at 182nd Street.

Angling Changes For 1959 Would Solve Problems

Most of its recommendations for changes in the 1959 angling regulations are only minor and technical, the Department of Fish and Game announced today. Spokesmen said the proposals are designed primarily to correct existing inequities in specific waters or to tighten a few loopholes which have created difficult enforcement problems in the past.

A proposal to require that all sport, ocean-caught salmon taken during the closed commercial fishing season be striped with vegetable dye to prevent bootlegging of sport fish for sale is one of the highlights.

Director Seth Gordon said this suggestion first was made about three years ago by a veteran party boat operator. "It seems to be worth a try," Gordon commented, "for something must be done to halt the widespread bootlegging of salmon along the north coast."

Coupled with the proposal to require the dye striping of salmon is the department's recommendation that no outrigger poles, no power gurdies and no sinkers weighing more than three pounds be permitted at any time in the ocean sport fishery north of Pt. Sur.

All-CIF Football Players For '58 Named By Helms Athletic Board

Southern California's finest prep gridiron performers over the past season, some 36 in number, were named for All-Southern California team honors this week, when members of the Helms Board of Football met in Los Angeles last week. It marked the 22nd season that the board has picked top performers from among football players in the Southern California area.

It did not take the selection committee long to come up with a Player of the Year for '58 CIF action and Long Beach Poly's Dee Andrews was the choice. Dee led his Jackrabbit team to the Harry J. Moore League title and then through four AAA CIF playoff games, including their 19-13 win over North High, and the Central Section title for 1958.

Fullback Ernie Thomsen, captain of the 1958 Pioneer League championship North High Saxons, was named third team fullback by the same board.

Player of the Year honors for the North-South selection of CIF Players for 1958 went

to San Moreno high school's outstanding quarterback Bill Redell, who led his Rio Hondo League champions to the finals of the AAA playoffs.

Awards will be presented to selected players and championship team coaches Jan. 10, by Paul H. Helms Jr., with coaches and former gridiron greats as special guests.

Dodgers Set League Records

Setting and breaking records is old stuff as far as the Dodgers are concerned, and last year was no exception. The 1958 Los Angeles club established a new National League record by making 198 double plays, breaking the former mark of 194 set by Cincinnati in three different seasons, 1928, 1931 and 1954. Moreover, three Dodgers led the league in their respective positions and one, Gil Hodges, tied another major league mark for most times leading first basemen in double plays with his

fourth season topping the league in this department. The Dodgers made 25 more double plays than the second-best DP club in the National League, the Pittsburgh Pirates, and they had a margin of 16 over the New York Yankees, American League twin-killing leaders.

Los Angeles Rams Deemed Crowd Pleasers With Offensive Players

Although the Los Angeles Rams fell one game short of tying for the Western Division championship, the 1958 squad was unquestionably the most exciting in Coach Sid Gillman's four year reign and perhaps ranks as one of the most crowd pleasing of all time.

Part of this was due to the club's explosiveness which produced a total of 45 touchdowns, nine of them coming on plays of more than 50 yards. Four more were set up by immediate preceding plays which went for more than half the distance of the field.

A total of 28 touchdowns — the average march on which was 68 yards — were scored in 96 plays. Hence on these six points, the Ram speedsters were using less than four plays to travel nearly three-quarters of the length of the field.

Another factor in the Ram offensive show, and also a solid contribution to their 8-4 finish, was the brilliant play of quarterback Bill Wade who in his first full year at the helm shattered four LA passing records as follows:
1. His 341 attempts surpassed Bob Waterfield's mark of 296 set in 1949.
