

# ENLISTMENTS REOPENED BY GUARD FOR NON-VETS

Major General Homer O. Eaton, Jr., commanding general of Southern California's National Guard 40th Armored Division, announced today that enlistments of men who have never had military service will again be accepted on a limited basis in various units of the division effective this week. Enlistments of these "non-prior service personnel" have been

frozen since last June. This should come as good news to high school seniors and all others under 18½ years of age who wish to complete their military obligation without interrupting their college or vocational careers for the two years required by selective service.

**MEN WITHOUT PRIOR MILITARY SERVICE**

who are accepted for enlistment will be required to take six months active duty for training commencing within two months after enlisting. The active duty training program includes two months of basic recruit training and four months of specialized technical training at a United States Active Army post.

**Men who complete the six**

months active duty training may go on to earn commissions as second-lieutenants by completing courses at one of the available officer candidate schools.


