Firms Asked To File State Tax Reports

John J. Campbell, executive officer of the Franchise Tax Board, said today that employers who are preparing Forms W-2 for the U.S. Internal Revenue Service should also prepare Forms 599 for the California Franchise Tax Board.

Employers are required to report to the State for each single employee who was paid \$2,000 or more and each married employee who was paid \$3,500 or more during 1958. If the employee is a resident of California, a Form 599 must be filed even though the services were performed outside California, Campbell stated.
