

**Brotherhood Week to Be Accented By Art Exhibit**

Plans were made public at a luncheon for artists last week that in honor of Brotherhood Month (February) there will be an art exhibit on the theme "The Human Equation."

Sponsored by Temple Menorah, 112 N. Catalina Ave., Redondo Beach, the exhibit will open Wednesday, Feb. 18. Open to the public, it will be on display Wednesday, Thursday and Friday nights from 8 to 1 p.m., and on Sunday, Feb. 22, from 2 to 5 p.m.

On opening night a reception for the artists and viewers is being planned. Jerome Alan Donson, director of the Long Beach Museum of Art, juror for the exhibit, will speak that evening at 9 p.m.

ON FRIDAY, Feb. 20, at 8:30 p.m., the public will be invited to attend sabbath services of the Jewish faith to be conducted by Rabbi Henri Front, spiritual leader of the temple. In honor of Brother-
