"This means that the people of Victoria Park will have their own library in the community and that the children attending the Towne avenue elementary school will be able to have additional books to read for pleasure and education," Supervisor Hahn stated.

He said that present plans are to locate the new library in the Victoria Park shopping center.

Book collections for children and adults will be placed in the new library as well as a number of periodicals. In addition, patrons of the library will be able to order any of the more than 1,000,000 volumes in the County Library system in the particular books they want are not on the shelves.


