

# C. C. Morgan, Former Plant Superintendent Here, In New Post

C. C. Morgan, former superintendent of the Columbia Geneva steel plant here, has been named general superintendent of the Geneva Works of the firm near Provo, Utah, it was announced in San Francisco yesterday. Effective date of the assignment is March 1, according to D. E. Rice, another former Torrance superintendent and now general manager-operations for the division.

In his new assignment, Morgan will assume responsibility for operations of the largest steelmaking operation of the Columbia-Geneva Division of U.S. Steel in the West.

Morgan was transferred to head up the Torrance plant in 1954 and served here until two years ago when he was returned to the Pittsburgh Works as superintendent.

He is a native of New Bethlehem, Pa., and attended public school there and later entered the U.S. Naval Academy at Annapolis. He received a B.S. degree in 1933. After six years active duty with the U.S. Navy, he joined the former Columbia Steel Co. plant at Pittsburgh as an industrial engineer.

He was returned to the Navy during World War II and received the Silver Star and

Legion of Merit for his Naval service. He was retired as a Captain after the war.

Morgan will succeed A. E. Terry at Geneva. Terry is retiring after 35 years of service. George A. Jadenoff will succeed Morgan as superintendent of the Pittsburgh works.

1970, according to a study by the Department of Special Services.

IN ADDITION to some 9600 elementary children now attending schools here (who will then be in high school), there are a possible 1300 more if present areas zoned for homes should be developed and a possible 1900 more if WALTERIA Lake and other areas not now zoned for housing should be rezoned. The birth rate also will be a factor.

There appears to be an increase in plans for apartment houses in the city, the report noted, and these may mean more children in a smaller area.

SCHOOL OFFICIALS have been studying possible sites for a fifth high school in the south-central part of town.

For the record, however, the county estimates that the city had 93,931 as of Jan. 1, 1959, and the new figure represents an addition of 3219 during the year.

EVEN WITH the conservative figures of the commission, Torrance still ranks fifth in size among the county's cities.

Los Angeles, of course, with an estimated 2,421,859 persons, is first, followed by Long Beach, Pasadena, Glendale, Torrance, Burbank, Santa Monica, Downey, Norwalk and Compton.

Redondo Beach ranks 17th in the county, Hermosa Beach 41st, Manhattan Beach 23rd, Palos Verdes 51st, Gardena 25th, and the two new Torrance area communities, Rolling Hills Estates and Rolling Hills 58th and 59th respectively.

## Backs Proposed Water District

City Councilmen passed a resolution endorsing the proposed formation of a water replenishment district at Tuesday night's Council meeting.
