

South Bay Church Of God Dedicates New Sanctuary

South Bay Church of God will dedicate its new sanctuary and educational facilities at a service to be held Sunday at 2:30 p.m. on the church premises, 17661 Yukon Ave. Participating in the dedica-

tion service will be Albert Isen, mayor, Rev. Hugh Percy, rector of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church and president of the Torrance Ministerial Association; Rev. Wilford Denton, pastor of College Park

Church of God and chairman of the Southern California Church of God Ministerial Assn.; Bob Wood, architect for Louis F. Gamble and Associates, and Gratz Lair, construction superintendent.

THE NEW building is of frame and stucco construction measuring 66 feet to the top of the cross. The sanctuary is 85 feet long and 42 feet wide. Located in the rear of the sanctuary is a two story educational unit containing a large assembly room and prayer room downstairs, and four large classrooms, plus furnace room, baptistry and two organ sound rooms upstairs.

Designed by Louis F. Gamble and Associates in Long Beach, the building was built entirely with donated labor under the supervision of Gratz Lair. A panel of California

Spanish tile, containing pieces of white crystal set in brown tile, adorns the front of the building. Blue panels on each side of the center panel highlight the arch of the roof. Tropical landscaping surrounds the structure.

AN INTERIOR color scheme of dusty yellow, spice, and beige complements the light ash paneling and woodwork. Interior decorator was Olive White of the Industrial Paint Co. The ash wood pulpit was built and donated by Mr. and Mrs. Gratz Lair.

Other donations include a communion table by Mrs. Melba Hobart and stained glass windows donated by members of the congregation. The steel baptistry was built by Buryl

White assisted by Jess Griffith and Bill Olds. By doing all the labor themselves the congregation kept costs of the building, which had been estimated by the contractor at \$125,000, down to under \$50,000. Construction began last Feb. 21. Seating capacity, including the choir loft and overflow, is 482.

Pastor of the eight-year-old congregation is Rev. Clifford L. Tierney.


