

Fluoridation Answer to Dental Problems, Doctors, Dentists Say

Next to the common cold, it is said, tooth decay is probably the most universal disease suffered by mankind. Even in families where good dental health practices are the rule, expensive repair and treatment are not unusual, while in lower income groups the need for care is still greater. The answer to the problem, according to medical and dental authorities, lies in the fluoridation of community water supplies. Roy O. Gilbert, M.D., County Health Officer, said this week.

Fluoridation of public water supplies has been done successfully in such large cities as Philadelphia, Washington and Chicago and in more than 1500 other cities and towns throughout the country. Nevertheless, for various reasons generally based on misinformation, there are still plenty of opponents to this dental health measure.

The addition of one part of fluoride per million parts of water to the water supplies of cities where natural fluorides in the water are lacking can reduce the incidence of cavities and decay in young chil-

dren by over 60 per cent. This can be done most inexpensively with no damage whatsoever to the health of the population. One of the suggestions made by persons who object to the fluoridation of water supplies is that the fluoride could be added to milk and that individuals could then use it or not as they pleased. However, fluoridation of milk has not yet been tested to the extent that water has and consequently is not one of the recommended procedures at the present time.

THERE is also the matter of cost. Adding fluorides to milk would be putting fluoridated milk in the same category as bottled water. The increased cost would make it too expensive for use in many families who perhaps need it the most. Furthermore, there is the difficulty of adequately supervising every individual dairy to see that the concentration of fluoride was held uniform. This would greatly increase the work of State officials who also have the task of supervising community water supplies.

A REPORT recently issued by the American Dental Assn. pointed out that for generations more than 4,000,000 Americans have been living all their lives in areas where the drinking water naturally contains fluorides in concentrations as high or higher than that recommended for dental health. The most painstaking research, it is said, has failed to reveal any adverse physiological effects other than mottling of the tooth enamel in areas where the fluoride concentration is much too high.

Fluoridation of community water supplies is a relatively simple, safe and inexpensive way of improving the dental health of children; still, some people have doubts on the subject and others oppose it for a variety of reasons.

HOWEVER, it is well to remember that many health measures, including smallpox vaccination and the pasteurization of milk, were vigorously opposed in the past but at now customary procedures for health protection.
