New Sportsman Beach Planned For Peninsula

Plans to construct a new ocean access way to Pt. Vicente County Park and develop a sportsman's beach near the tip of Palos Verdes peninsula were coordinated this week following allocation by the California State Wild Life Conservation Board of \$34,529 for this purpose.

County Supervisor Burton W. Chace, said County Park officials hope to award the construction contract not later than July 1.

The County recently acquired 1270 feet of rocky beach from the Federal Government, immediately adjoining Marineland on the northwest at Pt. Vicente. At present, there is no convenient public access to the 10-acre beach from the 150-foot high bluff overlooking the area.

The contract will call for the construction of a 1700-foot pedestrian ramp leading to the beach. An automobile parking area will be established on top of the bluff at the head of the ocean ramp. There will be a small picnic area.

Pt. Vicente Park Beach will be used primarily by surf fishermen and by skin divers. Its rocky terrain does not make the beach suitable for surf bathing, according to Supervisor Chace.

Water Co. Rate Case Hearing Set

Further hearing on an old rate case of the Narbonne Ranch Water Company No. 2, reopened by the California Public Utilities Commission, has been set for Monday, March 2, it was announced today. PUC Examiner Grant E. Syphers will preside at 10 a.m. in the American Legion Hall, 24702 Narbonne Ave., Lomita.

In December, 1953, the Commission authorized the company, which serves about 1100 customers in the Lomita and Torrance areas, to increase its rates, but at the same time ordered the utility to make substantial improvements to provide adequate service.


Since reopening the case, the Commission has held two days of public hearings in Lomita, one on Dec. 16 and the second hearing on Jan. 26.

Purpose of reopening the case, the Commission said, is to determine whether the 1953 decision should be "altered or amended in any respect or whether additional orders" should be issued.




