

GARDENERS CHECKLIST

1. Save that potted Poinsettia by giving it a complete rest for two or three months. Early in May, replot it to a larger size and start watering it again.
2. After pruning roses, spray them to catch any over-wintering pests and get the plants off to a healthy start.
3. Snails are ever with us. Use bait or pellets at scattered points in the garden for control.
4. Plant gladiolus at two-week or one-month intervals to have a succession of bloom through summer.
5. Check nurseries for flowering quince in bloom. You may find just the variety you've seen and wanted.
