

Chapel Starts Machinery for Four-Year College in District

Several years ago Nick Drake, councilman, City of Torrance, began talking about the need for a four-year state college in the southwest portion of Los Angeles County. During the past two years I have been discussing this problem with school superintendents, principals, supervisors, and teachers and administrators and teachers. Here is my A.B. No. 1688 which is co-authored by the following Members of the Assembly from Los Angeles County: Clayton Dills, Vincent Thomas, Don A. Allen, Seth J. Johnson, Vernon Kilpatrick, Carley V. Porter, George A. Willson, and Charles H. Wilson.

The bill reads as follows: "An act to add Article 14 (commencing at Section 25291) to Chapter 13 of Division 18 of the Education Code, as enacted by the Legislature at its 1959 Regular Session, relating to the establishment of a state college in the area of Los Angeles County and making an appropriation for site acquisition.

"The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Article 14 (commencing at Section 25291) is added to Chapter 13 of Division 18 of the Education Code, to read: "Article 14. State College for Los Angeles County "25291. There is hereby established a state college to be located in Los Angeles County, to be known by the name designated for it by the Director of Education. "25292. The provisions of Section 23601 to 23607, inclusive, Sections 23651 to 23958, inclusive, Sections 24051 to 24703, inclusive, and Sections 24951 to 24954, inclusive, and all other laws relating to state colleges are applicable to the state college established by this article.

"SEC. 2. The sum of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) is hereby appropriated from the State Construction Program Fund, to be expended by the Department of Education for the acquisition of a site for a state college to be located in Los Angeles County, bounded by the Pacific Ocean on the west and south and by Figueroa Street on the east and Venice Boulevard on the north. Site acquisition from such appropriation shall be subject to the Property Acquisition Law.

"The Department of Finance shall include the amount of this appropriation in the total amount of Budget Act appropriations in the same manner and with the same effect as if this appropriation had been included in a section of the Budget Act of 1959, as provided in the State Construction Program Bond Act of 1958 (Statutes of 1958 (First Extraordinary Session), Chapter 88)."

THE LEGISLATIVE Council's Digest of this bill reads: "AB 1688 as introduced, Chapel (Ed.), State college for Los Angeles County. Adds Art. 14 (commencing at Sec. 25291), Ch. 13, Div. 18, Ed. C. as enacted 1959 Reg. Sess.

Establishes a state college to be located in the southwestern portion of Los Angeles County. Appropriates \$500,000 from State Construction Program Fund for the acquisition of a site for the state college provided for in the act."

MY A.B. No. 1688 for our four-year state college is referred to the Assembly Committee on Education. On that committee there are 17 members, six of which are from Los Angeles County. The Los Angeles County Members are John L. E. ("Bud") Collier, Lou Cusanovich, Edward E. Elliott, Ernest R. Geddes, Carley V. Porter (who is a co-author of the bill and chairman of the Los Angeles delegation), and Bruce B. Reagan. There is a reasonable good probability that the bill may be passed out of the Assembly Education Committee, but then it may go to Assembly Committee on Ways and Means before it reaches the floor of the Assembly.
