

School Workers Get Okay on Joining Group

The Torrance Board of Education Tuesday night reaffirmed its policy of allowing employees freedom of choice to join any organization for the benefit of public education and the individual worker.

The stand was taken in response to a request for payroll deductions by the American Federation of State, County, and Municipal Employees, AFL-CIO, which has begun a drive to organize non-teaching employees in Torrance and several other neighboring school districts.

The board indicated it would consider the deductions when the union is organized and presents a charter or constitution to the district.

At the meeting, the board considered additions to its present policy, which provides that each employee is free to join employe organizations. However, decisions affecting

each employe are made without reference to membership or non-membership in these organizations under the policy. Dues for members in organizations may be collected through payroll deduction.

Additions to this policy were considered at the meeting included a statement that the board will recognize any employe organization if the names of all its local officers, employees, and members are filed with the board, together with its charter or other official documents.

County Health Officer Explains Causes, Types of Scalp Ringworm

WHILE RINGWORM of the scalp — of the human type, particularly — is contagious, it is not considered necessary to exclude an infected child from school. Nevertheless, it is imperative that medical instructions be followed very carefully

both in regards to the prescribed treatment and to the preventive measures that must be employed to prevent the spread of the disease. Otherwise, the child may be permitted to attend school and the period of infection may be unduly prolonged.

A pamphlet on ringworm in general, which includes a brief discussion of ringworm of the scalp, will be mailed to anyone who sends a card of request to the Division of Health Education, Los Angeles County Health Department, 241 N. Figueroa St., Los Angeles 12.



The disorder is caused by different species of vegetable parasites (fungi) that invade the outer layer of the scalp, the hair follicle, and eventually the hair shaft itself. In about 10 to 14 days, one or more oval, grayish-white patches appear on the scalp. These patches are not visible under ordinary light but can be seen as fluorescent areas when the scalp is examined under a Wood's light (filtered ultraviolet rays) in a completely blacked-out room.

IN THE EARLY stages of the infection, unless a Wood's light is used, the scalp and hair may look normal to the untrained eye, but soon the hair in each patch becomes dull and lifeless and breaks off about 1/4-inch above the scalp. This is often the first noticeable sign that an abnormal condition exists. The lesion or lesions usually expand to about the size of a dollar and eventually the hair drops off, resulting in bald areas (alopecia).

Generally speaking, there are three types of ringworm that affect the scalp and each is caused by a different fungus. The least bothersome is caused by fungus Microsporum lanosum. It is often referred to as the animal type of ringworm because it is spread chiefly by animal pets, particularly infected dogs and cats.

THE TWO so-called human types prevalent in this area are caused by the fungi, Microsporum audouini and Trichophyton tonsurans. These forms of the disease are usually spread from person to person, although T. tonsurans may also be carried by animals. Most adults and teenagers are resistant to Microsporum audouini infections. On the other hand, although children are more susceptible, all ages are subject to infection by the Trichophyton species.

Laboratory examination is required to determine the type of fungus, and the duration of the infection is directly related to the particular type that is found. The animal type, for instance, has a usual duration of 3 to 4 months, whereas the human types of the disorder persist for at least 5 months. In 97 per cent of all cases, the regrowth of hair is normal.
