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an upperclass course in subject. Upperclassmen with advanced standing are allowed to pursue advanced study in their field on a formal basis at El Camino College. Other enriched programs include summer school courses and honors classes, Harter said.

ALSO included in the realm of guidance in Torrance High Schools is the work experience program, according to Dr. Hamilton. Students over 16 years of age are given school credit for outside jobs which are correlated to their schooling by the teacher. Areas of work experience include sales, general — jobs other than general — and exploratory, which includes volunteer jobs such as nurses aids, playground assistants, or school clerical help.

In the contemporary problems course given to twelfth graders, the students learn how to get into college or the armed forces, and they are given college entrance exams, if they plan to continue their education, Dr. Hamilton stated. A key factor in the advantage of a unified school district was the coordinated and communicative transition from the elementary to the high school level. In Torrance, Dr. Hamilton said, the high schools come out to the elementary schools to talk to the teachers, staff and parents of the eighth graders; and the programming on the ninth grade level is based specifically on the individual students eight grade achievements.
