

Lomita Baptist Church to Join Nation-Wide Crusade

The First Baptist Church of Lomita cooperated with the Los Angeles Baptist Assn. in a Mission Tour last Saturday morning. Sixteen Junior Girls along with their leaders visited the Korean Mission in downtown Los Angeles, where Rev. Don Kim, the pastor, lead a service with the girls singing in English and others of the mission singing the same hymn in Korean. Following this the group of more than 165 "G. A.s.", under the leadership of Mrs. Ruth King, proceeded to the Baptist Indian Center, where luncheon was served on the mission patio.

This week the First Baptist Church will become a part of a nation-wide crusade of six major Baptist groups numbering 19 million Baptists, in 75,000 Churches. Southern Baptists are the largest of the group with a total membership of more than 9,000,000 members in 31,000 churches and missions.

Speakers for this occasion will include Rev. James Bell,

pastor of the Second Baptist Church, Norwalk, and Rev. Bill Austin, pastor of the First Southern Baptist Church of Palo Alto. The music will be under the direction of Dick Wallner, local music director. A full choir will present special numbers each evening. James Bell is a former Combat Pilot who answered the call to the ministry while serving in the 14th Air-Force in China. While in service he was awarded the Flying Cross with oak leaf cluster, the Air Medal, and Combat citations. He is a forceful speaker and has a vital message for the youth of our area.

Mr. Austin is the young author of "Talks to Timothy," a member of the writing staff of the Sunday School Board of Nashville on Youth Needs of Today. He is the pastor of the First Southern Baptist Church of Palo Alto. Accompanying him will be "Skipper" his ventriloquist friend so popular with children and young people.

Narbonne Church to Open Revival Services Sunday
